

<p>What if...</p> <p>You had been asked by Hashem to persuade Moshe to take the job? What would you have said? (at any point)</p>	<p>What if...</p> <p>You had been a slave, what aspect would you find the hardest?</p>
<p>What if...</p> <p>Life has become harder after Moshe Rabbeinu approached Pharoah for the first time – straw was taken away. How would you have felt towards Moshe? (Avadim Hayinu)</p>	<p>What if...</p> <p>You had been there in the plague of darkness, how would you feel rummaging through their drawers? (plagues)</p>
<p>What if...</p> <p>You had been there in the plagues, what do you think you would have learnt about Hashem? (plagues)</p>	<p>What if...</p> <p>Moshe Rabbeinu had instructed you to ask the Egyptians for their gold and silver, how comfortable would you have been to ask? Was there any reason not to? (at any point)</p>
<p>What if...</p> <p>You knew that some of your friends might not make it out of Egypt, what do you think their struggle was? (at any point)</p>	<p>What if...</p> <p>You saw Moshe striking the Egyptian and killing him. What impression would you have formed of Moshe? (at any point)</p>

<p>What if...</p> <p>You had been there at Krias Yam Suf? How would you have reacted? (Dayeinu)</p>	<p>What if...</p> <p>You had eaten 'mon' (mannah) – what taste would you have selected? (Dayeinu)</p>
<p>General discussion point: We don't eat anything after Afikomen to keep the taste of Seder in our mouth! What memory will you take from this year's Seder night?</p>	<p>General discussion point: There is a promise that the Western Wall will never be destroyed. Even though Jerusalem has been conquered 14 times and razed to the ground nine times the Wall still stands. What request will you put in the Wall next time you go?</p>
