3. The word Mitzrayim (Egypt) resembles the Hebrew word for constriction. What is your personal Mitzrayim? What is holding you back the most?
4. When speaking about the harsh slavery: In our day-to-day lives, do we really love what we do or are we more like slaves to our work?
5. If you knew for certain that God would help you succeed, even through miracles, what new endeavour would you take on?

Questions aimed mainly at adults

Questions mainly aimed at children

6. God performed many miracles in Egypt. Are there signs around us that God exists? What are they?
7. When speaking about jumping in the Red Sea: What have you done recently that was very difficult but you still managed to do it?
8. When singing Dayenu: What are the gifts in your life that you are grateful for?
9. What Mitzvot/Jewish gifts are you most thankful for? Israel? Shabbat? Torah? Something else?
10. When reciting Hallel: If you could say thank-you to someone in your life who really makes a difference, who would it be and why?

AND FINALLY... The Seder seems to revolve around the involvement of the children (we do lots of things just to get them to ask questions). Why of all the festivals is Pesach the festival in which we value the involvement of the children more than any other?
