

The קידוש ורחץ cards

Print the קידוש ורחץ on card (lamine if possible) and cut them to size.

Enjoy the different ways these cards can be used.

During the Seder

1. Place them around in the room at random visible places. All must try to remember when the family is up to that part. All or one of the children jumps up and get that card once you have reached that stage in the Hagada. He then places the card against their Kidush cup and keeps it there as long as that 'action' (part of the Seder) is taking place.
2. If you prefer to omit the running around hand them out alternatively and let all have a turn to display the card.
3. What about the one leading the Seder (or someone else) sticking that card in his hat or her hairband.

Before the Seder or during the next day

Use it as a game for all to get acquainted with the order of the Seder.

- Clear the table to have adequate space.
- Mix the cards
- Put the pile of cards text facing down.
- Pull one card and put on the table as a starter card.
- The first participant picks a card from the pile – if it belongs before the one already on the table, then he puts it at the right of that card; if its place is afterwards he puts it on the left side.
- The next participant takes a card and puts it in its correct place (which can be between the cards that are already out).
- All participants have a turn. You then go back to the first one and all have another go. Carry on till all cards are finished.

Variations

- ❖ Let the older children have a turn on their own. See if they can get all the cards right. Not succeeding the first time? Try again practice makes perfect.
- ❖ Grandparents or visitors? Let them have a go too!
- ❖ One picks a card and doesn't show which one it is. He then gives a clue, for example, "we say the Beracha of Ha'adama during this one." The first one to say Karpas gets the card and puts in in the right order. "We sing a song of a goat during this one (Gad Gadya)" the one who says Nirtza, take the card and find its right place.
