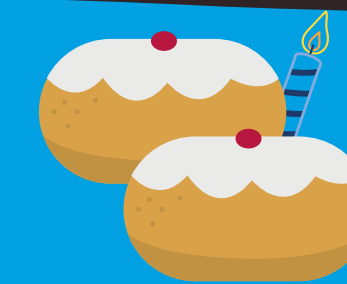

On Chanukah we stand up proud of our Jewish heritage, values and impact

Eight family-focused lessons from the Chanukah candles:

1. The Chanukah candles are small flames that have a hugely illuminating impact. Our children too are small flames who can make a huge impact in their own lives and the lives of those around them.
2. Flames are most impactful when they are clear and clean. In nurturing our children to shine make sure to surround them with the best possible environment.
3. The Chanukah candles will not be noticed as much in a bright room. Ensure your child feels they are unique and not outshone by everyone else - make sure they can individually shine.
4. The Chanukah candles illuminate a dark room. Sometimes our best qualities are cultivated in the face of struggle.
5. We light the newest candle first. Our Judaism has to have a sense of refreshing newness - if we treat it as something consigned to years past it will not thrive.
6. The Menorah is lit at home. Judaism is not confined to the school, synagogue or youth group. Its roots begin in every Jewish home.
7. We light one more candle each day. Every day we can appreciate something else that Hashem blesses us with in our lives.
8. Before we light the Chanukah candles we recite blessings. Whenever we experience something inspiring as a family, frame it with speech (speak about what it means) so it has the greatest possible impact.
